PURPOSE OF THE POSITION

Counsellor/Case Managers will provide intake & assessment, counselling and case management to various clients such as individuals, couples, families and children, to support clients to address issues which impact their wellbeing and their ability to maintain safe and enriching relationships.

The role may also involve the facilitation of psycho-educational & therapeutic groups including an Accredited Men's Behaviour Change course, Post Separation and specialist Parenting and Relationship Education courses.

These roles are based at Bankstown, Fairfield and Liverpool and client services are provided one evening a week at these locations.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Perform the duties of the role in accordance with CatholicCare's Mission, Vision and Guiding Principles
- To maintain professional currency and familiarity with related evidence-based practice and literature in relation to the provision of counselling, post separation and couple counselling and case management
- To maintain a focus on the safety and well being for clients and their families, underpinned by a thorough understanding of child development, individual and systemic issues and Domestic and Family Violence
- To maintain a good knowledge of relevant internal and external services to make client referrals as appropriate
- To comply with all agency and program policies and procedures including all documentation and administrative tasks required by the program including writing case notes and data collection
- To attend and participate in individual and group clinical supervision
- To maintain a thorough and up to date understanding of the relevant provisions of the Family Law Act (1975) the Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act (1998) and other relevant legislations applicable to Family Counsellors and to operate at all times with cognizance of the legislative provisions to maintain an understanding of Post Separation issues and Family Law processes
- To deliver a wide range of clinical and support services to Men (and their families) including Intake and Triage Assessments, Information sessions, case planning and management, and therapeutic interventions that are in accordance with relevant professional practice standards
- To maintain professional currency and familiarity with related literature and practices in relation to working with Men within Domestic and Family Violence frameworks



- To maintain professional currency and familiarity with related literature and practice standards in relation to working with Men's Behaviour Change – Partner Support (Women and Children's Advocacy) frameworks
- To facilitate service delivery in CatholicCare offices and outreach settings as required
- To participate in local networks to promote CatholicCare.
- Participate in the expansion of counselling services to complement other CatholicCare programs
- Other duties as directed from time to time
