About the Role

We are seeking an experienced and passionate Youth worker to join CatholicCare's Cook and Phillip Program. Our program works closely with the local youth to strengthen their confidence and build on their unique skills, abilities and aspirations. In this role you will assist with the delivery of youth programs, which includes the planning and facilitation of education, employment and life skills courses and workshops, and community development activities and events.

This is a part time opportunity until 30 June 2021, and the required working days are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Based in Woolloomooloo, outreach services across Sydney will be required.

Successful applicants will ideally have:

- Ability to undertake the duties of the role in accordance with CatholicCare's Mission, Vision and Values and its Code of Ethics and Conduct
- University Qualifications in Social Work/Psychology/Social Welfare/Education or Diploma of Community Services (Youth Work)
- Awareness and understanding of trauma informed practice
- Experience working with vulnerable young people
- Knowledge of youth social issues, barriers and engagement strategies
- Experience facilitating community development activities including workshops and events
- Ability to effectively engage, communicate and collaborate with young people and a range of stakeholders and referrers internally and externally
- Demonstrated experience in working with culturally and linguistically diverse communities and with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities
